She had a rare opportunity to study mega-fire impacts on fungi when her plots burned down in two catastrophic mega-fires in California.


3. **BMS Recording Network News**

4. A Provisional Census Catalogue of the Myxomycetes of the Forest of Dean

The Gloucestershire Naturalists' Society has published a special issue of their journal on the Myxomycetes of the Forest of Dean. Based on data gathered over many years by members of the Dean Fungus Group, and compiled by John Holden, the checklist includes 17 distribution maps and 75 photographic illustrations of many of the 144 species listed. Introductory chapters on the nature and diversity of slime moulds, and tips on collection and identification should be of wider interest. It is hoped that this book will inspire a wider awareness of these amazing and little-known organisms.
